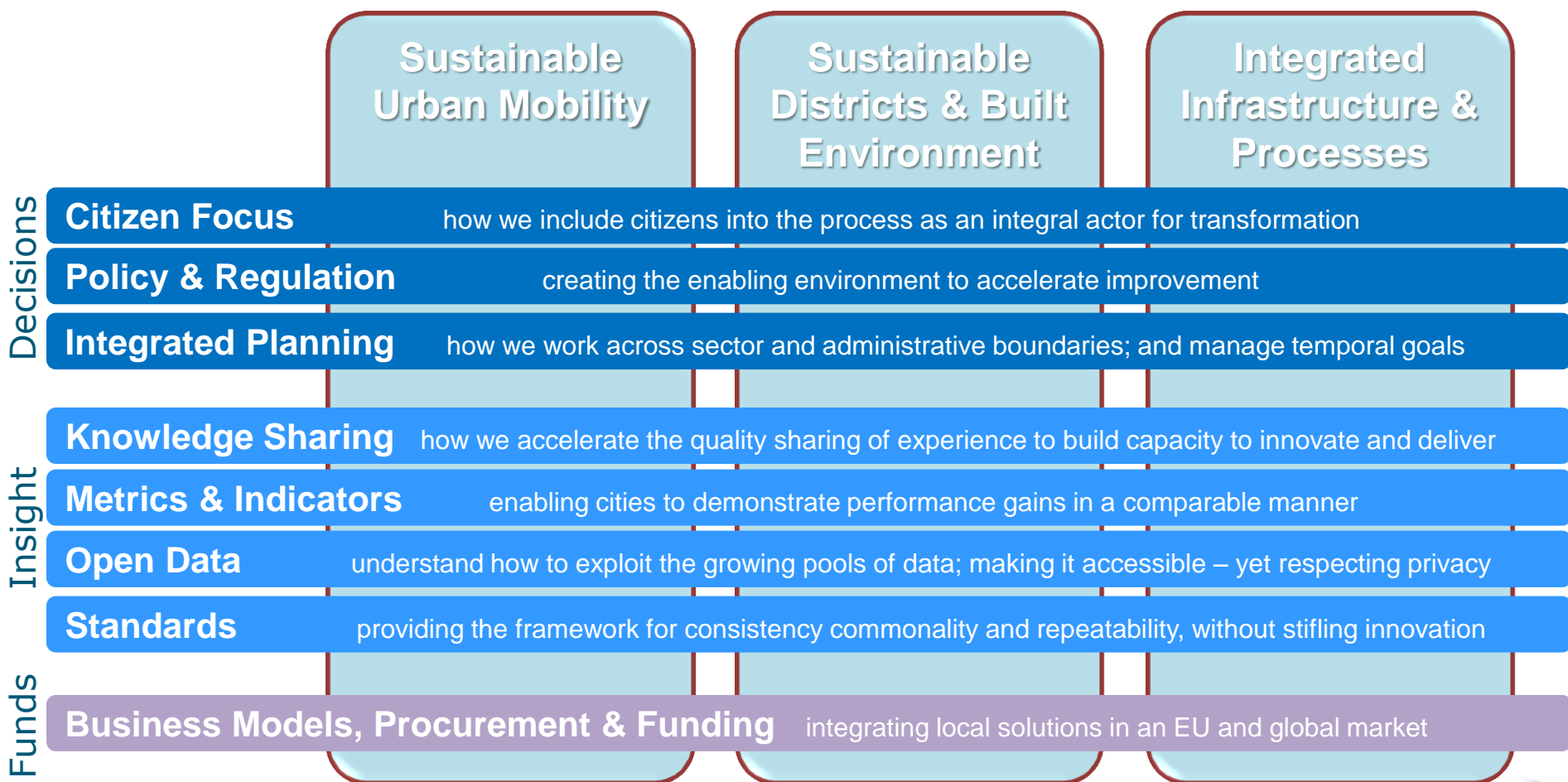

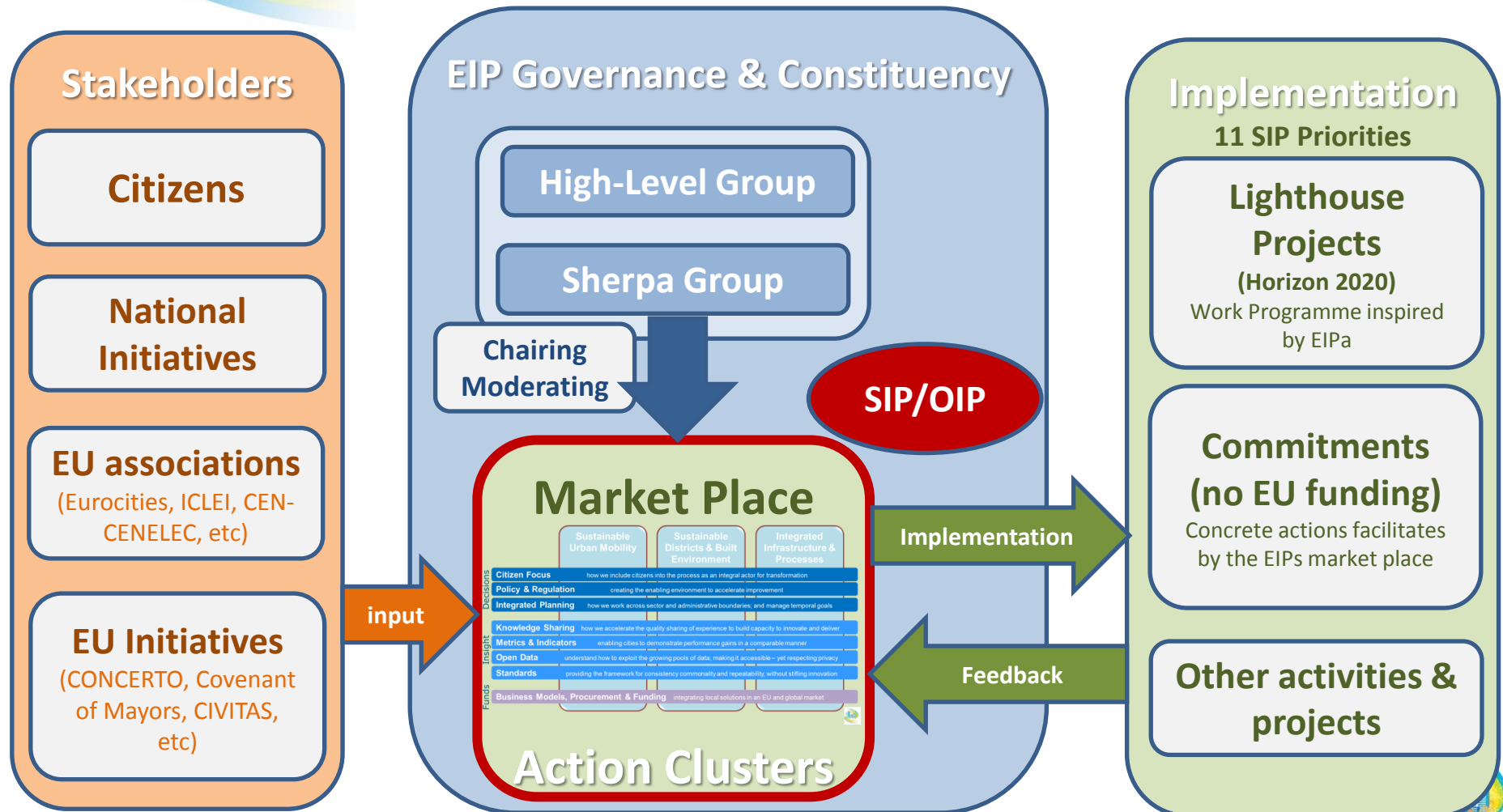

- **Open** to cities, communities, companies, research, individuals, etc.
- Commitment: **voluntary intention to provide a concrete engagement** in support to the priority areas of the Strategic Implementation Plan



High involvement

- Strong response to the Invitation for Commitment
- True success: **441 commitments received**
- **370 eligible commitments...**
- ... bringing together **more than 3000 partners ...**
- ... from **32 countries.**
- **Public authorities** are in the **lead** in **36%** of all cases, **business** in **26%**.
→ *nicely balanced!*



Evolution

Action Clusters will be key to promote collaborative processes for implementing **actions in priority areas**, based in five objectives:

- **Peer review** for existing and new actions
- **Critical mass** and visibility
- **Boost the learning curve** and EU competitiveness
- Share efforts to **eradicate barriers**
- **Link cities and industry**



The story behind Action Clusters

- **More concerted action** between cities and industries is needed to accelerate large-scale roll-out of promising solutions
→ *get markets moving*
- Bringing together innovative ideas and actions from across Europe to support a **dynamic market place**
→ *core ambition for this EIP*
- Invitation for Commitments/Action Clusters are **distinct and independent from Calls under Horizon 2020**
→ *not a funding instrument!*



Action Clusters: Core of the Market Place

- Fora for **participants of commitments submitted under the respective priority area** of the Strategic Implementation Plan and **other commitments with strong links to this area.**
- **Geared towards implementation.**
- Expected to come forward with **concrete targets and work plans.**
- Facilitated by **online collaboration tools, searchable database** for commitments, projects, best practises, etc.

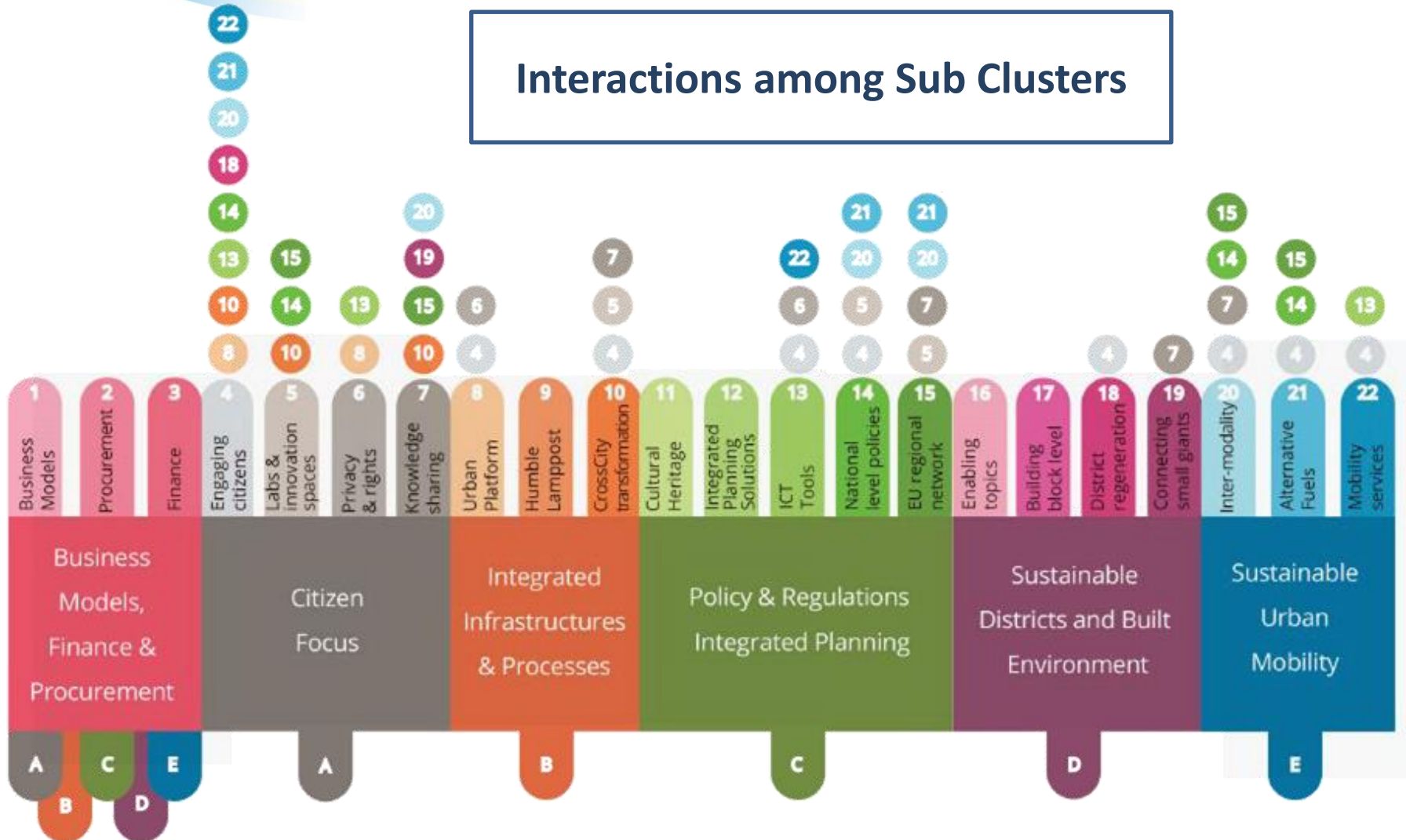

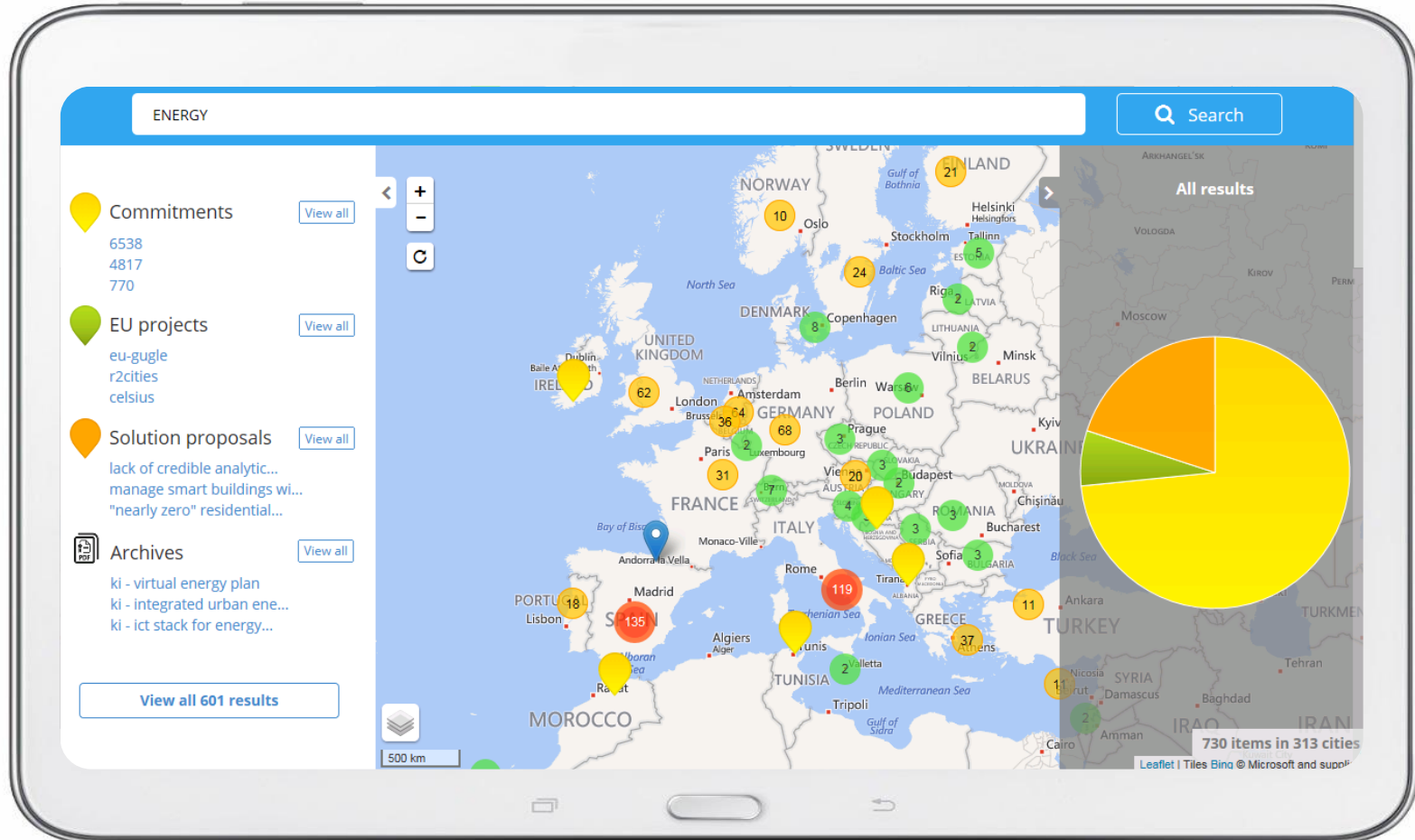

Business Models, Finance and Procurement

Cities need a framework to enable economic viability of smart city solutions. This viability should be provided via **new Business Models, Finance and Procurement tools**.

The priorities are to:

- Create new integrated **business models** with **innovative local partnerships** (Local Ecosystem) and **adapted procurement**;
- Create a **European market for innovation** that opens up investments.

Striving for broad uptake across Europe of smart city solutions requires in most cases new investments in combination with a more efficient use of the currently available resources in cities. Citizens' support is important to get the needed initiatives going and accepted. Innovative solutions will only create jobs and growth if the market-pull from cities leads to a broad activation along the value chain to supply new materials for mobility and housing, new ICT systems to deal with the large amount of data and new energy systems. Combining existing available technologies and solutions is not enough. There is a need for a dynamic system of continuous improvement, creating the European critical mass for innovation uptake within available budgets and leading to sustainable growth and jobs.

The main challenges are:

- Balance cities' individual characteristics and requirements with the need for a modular approach which offers economies of scale and therefore **cheaper and more broadly available technology solutions**;
- Balance **city/regional requirements** and strategies with **national or broad EU policy goals** (industrial policy);
- Ensure long-term planning to **build trust for (de-risk) investments**.

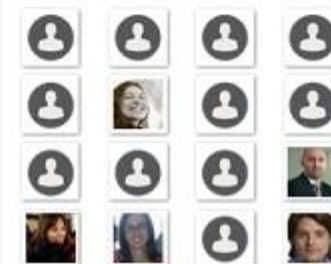
