





The Hybrid User Forum is an independent part of the European research project 'Hybrid Commercial Vehicles,' and is funded entirely by the 7th Framework Programme of the European Commission



### What is the Hybrid User Forum?

The Hybrid User Forum is a forum for users – and potential users – of hybrid commercial vehicles in Europe to meet, exchange ideas and experience, and to provide input directly to researchers and manufacturers on their needs as users.

### Why a forum?

The European Commission is currently funding research for technical development of urban buses and delivery vehicles through the European Hybrid Commercial Vehicle Project (www.hcv-project.eu), an FP7 European land transport research project that involves manufacturers, component suppliers and researchers. The project is working on reducing fuel consumption, increasing overall environmental performance, and enabling a mass market introduction.

The EC wanted a forum for independent exchange among users – both bus operators as well as public authorities and user networks – to help set frameworks for operating hybrid buses (e.g. air quality management,  $CO_2$  reduction, noise abatement) to ensure that the needs of users were represented and that communication between researchers and practitioners was ensured.

## The Hybrid User Forum was established to foster the link between researchers and the users of hybrid commercial vehicles.

The Hybrid User Forum also has a section focussing specifically on trucks and delivery vehicles. The first workshop will take place in autumn 2011. Contact us to find out more or to apply for membership.

### How the forum works

The forum offers workshops, thematic exchange and presentations on pilot projects from within the EU and beyond. The Forum supports a bi-directional exchange of experience and knowledge between users and researchers. We have established a website (www.hybriduserforum.eu) and will host four face-toface workshops over the period May 2011 to December 2013.

### Workshops

The Hybrid User Forum is arranging three one-day workshops each for the bus sector and for the truck sector, and one joint meeting of both sectors, between 2011 and 2013 to discuss expectations of potential hybrid commercial vehicle users, technical requirements and the (potential) barriers to the adoption of hybrid vehicles.

### Who should join the Hybrid User Forum?

We're looking for Forum members who represent bus operators, public authorities and user networks from all across Europe from both large and small jurisdictions.

### Independence

The Hybrid User Forum is fully EU-financed and not part of the Hybrid Commercial Vehicle consortium. It is run independent of the Hybrid Commercial Vehicle project as a venue for exchange between (potential) users of hybrid commercial vehicles in Europe and the project consortium, which represents mainly OEMs and related research. The Forum's reports will be available publicly to all interested parties and are not in any way restricted to the HCV project consortium.
